STORY

The Judge then enters and tells of how he has attained his position as Judge by making love to the ugly daughter of a rich attorney, only to throw the lady over on achieving his ambition.

Counsel enters and the jurymen are sworn. The plaintiff is called and the Judge takes a fancy to her.

Things look black for Edwin who, in his own defence, says he is prepared to marry Angelina today and his new love tomorrow.

Although this seems reasonable to the Judge, Counsel maintains that it is a serious crime to marry two wives at a time. This is indeed a dilemma. Angelina declares her love for Edwin who repulses her. Then Counsel and Angelina object to the Judge's bright idea of testing Edwin's words that when tipsy he would thrash and kick her,
